For the safety of the rider, volunteer, equine, and staff, each rider will be evaluated by staff to determine if riding is a safe and appropriate activity. All clients are required to have a medical release on file by the current physician or health care provider.

Riding is not appropriate for everyone. Seabiscuit Therapeutic Riding Center may have to decline services to those for whom riding is contraindicated. According to PATH International guidelines, riding is contraindicated if:

- Staff is unable to safely manage the client in any situation, including an emergency dismount.
- The safety or comfort of the horse is compromised.
- The student meets the criteria of precautions or contraindications. (Please refer to the “Possible Reasons for Rider Discharge” section below).

Attire:

- All students must wear ASTM-SEI safety helmets while mounted or doing ground work. Helmets are provided, but participants can bring their own ASTM-SEI helmets, if preferred.

- All students must wear fully closed-toe (no holes) shoes for safety.
- All students must wear pants (unless otherwise discussed with the instructor).

Safety Rules:

- *A parent or caregiver* is required to remain on site or, after checking in with the instructor, to be available by phone.

- Children may not be unattended to run or play loudly at the facility.

- Dogs are required to be on leash and are not allowed in the lesson area.

Possible Reasons for Rider Discharge:

The following are reasons that may lead to discharge of a student from the program:

- The rider has reached all of his/her goals and is ready to graduate.
- The rider is unable to maintain head/neck control while riding, which creates a contraindication to riding.
- The rider's behavior is contradictory to riding and presents a safety risk to the rider, volunteers, horses, or staff.

- A change in diagnosis, medication, or emotional condition which makes therapeutic riding inappropriate.
- The rider misses four scheduled appointments without 24 hours prior cancellation.
- Fees not paid as agreed upon.
